- Complying with all regulatory requirements and collaboratively contributing to regulatory authorities' industry understanding.
- Maintaining dual certification to internationally recognised Responsible Wood® (RW/1-21-3) and Forest Stewardship Council® (FSC®-C107541) standards.

- Monitoring and actively reducing our carbon emissions
- Recognising the positive role of plantations in capturing and sequestering carbon in both standing trees and harvested wood products
